Introduction

The NATO Communications and Information Agency (NCIA) hereby notifies the following Procurement Opportunity in accordance with the Procedure for NATO Competitive Procurement ([link](#)). This notification is issued to foster open and fair competition among eligible vendors from participating nations. This notification does not constitute a commitment to award a contract.

Vendors are invited to review the requirements described herein and to submit their bids in accordance with the instructions provided in this notification and subsequent solicitation documentation. All interested vendors are reminded that timely registration and compliance with eligibility requirements are essential, as deadlines for submission may not be extended. Vendors are advised to regularly check for updates to this notification.

This opportunity reflects NATO's commitment to transparency, equal treatment of suppliers, and the efficient delivery of goods, works, and services in support of NATO missions and participating nations.

All eligible and responsible sources may submit a quotation, bid, or proposal, which shall be considered by the NCIA.

1. Title of Procurement Opportunity

Provision of Occupational Health & Safety Services for NCIA

2. Description of Requirement

Project Objective

The NATO Communications and Information Agency (NCIA) is required to ensure compliance with applicable Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) regulations across all locations and to maintain effective control of OHS risks within its operations. The Agency operates across multiple host nations with differing regulatory frameworks and varying levels of risk visibility. At present, there is a need to establish an Agency-wide baseline of OHS risks and a consolidated view of applicable regulatory requirements. To address this, the Agency requires external support to establish regulatory clarity, develop a baseline understanding of risks across its footprint, and provide ongoing operational OHS support. Baseline information and documentation may be available at selected locations; however, such information is not currently standardised or consolidated at Agency level.

The purpose of this bidding is to enable the Agency to engage a qualified contractor capable of implementing an Agency-wide Occupational Health and Safety support capability.

The Agency seeks to establish a sustainable, scalable and performance-driven OHS capability, combining regulatory compliance, risk management, and continuous improvement across its multi-site environment.

Scope of Work

PHASE 1: REGULATORY OVERVIEW & BASELINE RISK ASSESSMENT:

- **Regulatory Overview:** Identify and document all applicable OHS legislation and regulatory requirements for each host nation and NCIA location.
- **Baseline Risk Assessment:** Conduct structured OHS risk assessments at all locations where these have not yet been completed, using a standardised and repeatable methodology aligned with ISO 45001 principles. Establish a consistent, comparable baseline of risks identifying mitigation measures and recommendation for improvement.

Deliverables:

- Regulatory compliance matrix (by location).
- Baseline risk assessment reports (by location).
- Summary report with findings, recommendations, and prioritised action plan (by location)

PHASE 2: MANAGEMENT SYSTEM DESIGN & IMPLEMENTATION

- **OHS Management System Design and Implementation:** Develop, in consultation with Agency OHS, an updated OHS Management System, including policies, procedures, and compliance tools, in line with ISO 45001 requirements.
- **Documentation:** Provide procedures and associated templates for risk registers, incident logs, corrective action tracking, and reporting formats.

Deliverables:

- Updated OHS Management System documentation, including Procedures, templates and tools for ongoing compliance;
- Recommendations for OHSMS maintenance and improvement.

PHASE 3: OPERATIONAL SUPPORT & CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

- **Routine OHS Activities:** In line with the ISO 45001 requirements, deliver routine and essential OHS activities
- **Continuous Improvement:** Provide annual improvement plans, benchmarking, and innovation proposals. Continuous improvement is a core contractual requirement.

Deliverables:

- Routine OHS activity reports (quarterly/annual).
- Incident investigation and corrective action tracking reports.
- Annual improvement and benchmarking reports.
- Digital dashboards and standardised reporting formats.

Deliverables are intended to enable operational decision-making, risk reduction, and measurable improvement in OHS performance across the Agency
